### President – David Darnell

Our newsletter usually allows us to report on things that have happened. In this issue, we also have a few things that didn't happen. The coronavirus has caused the cancellation of MHF activities at Five Oaks, including summer tours, and our planned 2020 Spring Gala. This has resulted in the loss of income that would have been used in the ongoing preservation and restoration efforts at Five Oaks.

There has been activity at Five Oaks since our last newsletter. After the completion of the most recent phase of exterior restoration, the Foundation began the task of replacing the increasingly unreliable lift with a new elevator. The installation was nearly complete when the virus outbreak caused the cancellation of most events at Five Oaks. The new elevator is now in operation and is ready for service when activities resume at Five Oaks.

While significant portions of the slate roof were put into top condition last summer, there have been minor water issues that have surfaced. One of these areas is above the ceiling in "Aunt Annie's" room. This is believed to be from a leak in the rubber material on the floor of the north balcony, which is just above the fireplace in that bedroom. Repairs have been made by Advanced Industrial Roofing. Fred Horner, President of the company and former board member, has donated his firm's services for the repair.

Although activities at Five Oaks have been curtailed, there is still a constant need for restoration. This mission will continue with the continued support of memberships, donations of our members, and grants. Thank you!

### **Kendal / Union Cemetery Pole Dedication & Flag Raising Ceremony**

Last summer, the Massillon Heritage Foundation erected a monument to Massillon's early settlers at The Kendal Burying Ground on the corners of Andrew Avenue and 9th St NE. Thanks to the efforts of Massillon Heritage Foundation board member John Patrick Picard, a flagpole has now been placed at the site. The pole was originally located at the former Doctors Hospital. It was preserved and donated through the generosity of Bob Gessner and James Marshall. The City of Massillon Parks and Recreation Department, who maintains the property, was responsible for the installation. John Patrick and Kim Picard have installed solar lighting at the top of the pole and have donated the first flag.

The August 22 flag raising ceremony was attended by about 60 people. MHF vice-president Doug Scheetz delivered the opening remarks. A wreath was placed at the monument by Louise Moore of the Massillon Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The flag was raised by members of the American Legion Post 221. After all recited the Pledge of Allegiance, The National Anthem was sung by Patty Carmola. Massillon Mayor Kathy Catazarro-Perry was the speaker. Her remarks were followed by the benediction, given by Major Tom Perks of the Massillon Salvation Army.

### **A Moment in History ~ John Meinhart, the contractor and stone mason at Five Oaks**

John was born August 15, 1848 in Bensheim, Germany in the state of Hesse. His parents were Johann Meinhardt and Maggie Schuman. Johann Meinhardt or Meinhard was a stone mason and builder and there is at least one church still standing that he worked on in Bensheim. Johann died very young at the age of 38.

John Meinhart (dropped the 'd' in the US) came to the USA in 1867 or so. He may have come with his mother and three sisters or they came later. He either landed in NYC or travelled there afterwards. He married Amelia Bangert in NYC in 1872. After seven years in NYC and having three children, they moved to Massillon, Ohio. They had a total of 11 children. He died at the age of 79 and he is buried in St. Mary's cemetery along with many other Meinharts. His mother and two sisters died in NYC and one sister moved near him in Canton where she died.

John started his general contracting business, John Meinhart and Sons in Massillon. His company laid the brick for the streets in Massillon. They built St. Mary's Church, the Charles Steese House, Five Oaks, schools and many other churches and homes around OH, IN and PA.

### **A note from his great, great granddaughter, Michelle De Long:**

We heard many stories about Five Oaks from our Great-Grandfather Edward Meinhart, (John's son) but the one that we remember most is that when the floors were put in and the varnish was applied and dried, my great grandfather (he was 12 at the time) and his siblings were brought into Five Oaks and they skated around the floors in their stocking feet to polish and buff the floors!

I have attached a photo of John and Amelia with their children and a photo of John, his sons, and workers with the stone for the buildings. Our great grandfather is in the back row third from the right. John Meinhart is in the front row second from the left.



Michelle's cousin Lisa has done research on John and how much he and his sons built in Massillon. She did this research by reading through the Massillon Newspaper archives. This is an abbreviated list of buildings that they partially helped build and helped worked on some of the stonework.

at SW corner of Erie and North St (razed)

**Pille Bldg** – Lincoln Way W (razed, currently part of the Walgreen's site)

**Grabber Bldg** – SE corner of Tremont & 6th St SW (destroyed by fire)

**Schuster Brewing Co** – West side of Tommy Henrich Dr (razed)

There are more structures, but this is a good idea of how much of Massillon John Meinhart built; and that his work should be attributed to him.

## CAPITAL CAMPAIGN – NEW ELEVATOR AT FIVE OAKS

The new elevator at Five Oaks is now a reality. In late January, workers began removing the old lift and then installing the new elevator. Work continued for over two months. During the days and hours that the Massillon Woman's Club was not staffed, a Massillon Heritage Foundation board member was on site (approximately 225 hours).

Automatic doors are one of the major improvements in the new unit. It will service all five levels – floors 1, 2, and 3, basement, and the outside ground level. The control panel features pushbuttons to select the desired levels, opening and closing of doors, and an emergency call button that will reach a live person, 24 hours a day, if needed.

The elevator was custom built to fit in the existing shaft, which was constructed by The Massillon Heritage Foundation about 20 years ago. The machinery room in the basement next to the shaft is also being used for the new equipment. There are many, many pieces and parts in the new system that most of its users will never see. Over 60 photos taken during the project show various components and stages of the construction and are available for viewing at the Massillon Heritage Foundation Facebook page.



The board of the MHF appreciates the generosity of all the foundation members who contributed to our Capital Campaign, and to the Massillon Woman's Club, who has committed \$75,000 to the project. The total cost of the elevator was nearly \$ 170,000. Thanks to all who contributed to this project!

To receive and administer funds for the purpose of acquiring, restoring, preserving and maintaining properties of historical significance to Massillon and the surrounding area for use in scientific, educational and charitable purposes.
