Improvements and restoration projects are underway at Five Oaks. The exterior restoration has taken far longer than we expected but is again moving along. Other projects are moving at a much faster pace. These are made possible through the memberships and additional gifts of members of the Massillon Heritage Foundation. Thank you for your generous support.

Please join us on May 11th for The Massillon Heritage Foundation Spring Gala. The evening will include dinner at Five Oaks, followed by a program by playwright Lee Lavery titled "Happy days are 'Beer' Again". Don't miss an enjoyable evening at Five Oaks. More information will appear later in this newsletter.

Exterior Lighting ~ The new exterior lighting has been installed. The new and much improved floodlights make Five Oaks look fantastic during the evening hours. Attractive new fixtures were also installed at the sidewalk entrances. The new lighting is far more effective and is more energy efficient than the old fixtures. There are still minor adjustments to be made to the floodlights that should further enhance the beauty of Five Oaks at night.

Exterior Restoration ~ The masonry and roof restoration project is slowly moving ahead. The project is largely funded by a \$350,000 grant from the State of Ohio. Construction is expected to begin in early May on the North and East elevations of the house, and beginning in late June, the South and West elevations and roof. We anticipate completion of this major work by the end of August. Efforts will be made to avoid, as much as possible, disruptions to Massillon Woman's Club events.

Elevator Replacement - We are in the beginning stages of replacement of the elevator, which is not an elevator but a "lift". A lift has limits on its usage that an actual elevator would not have. The current lift has been extremely disappointing over the years in terms of performance and reliability. A new elevator would be custom made to fit in the existing shaft. Among the many improvements would be automatic doors, eliminating the current trouble-prone folding "accordion doors". The present lift is nearly 20 years old and seems to be in constant need of expensive repairs. Drawings have been prepared and sent out to contractors. We should know the costs involved for the project by early May.



Kendal Burying Ground Monument - The Kendal Burying Ground monument will soon be in place. The site on the corner of Andrew Ave. and 9th St NE is being prepared for the installation of the marker. When The Massillon Heritage Foundation was organized over 40 years ago, it was established primarily for the preservation and restoration of Five Oaks. It was also intended to promote and preserve other historical sites in Massillon. We are taking a small step in that direction with the placement of a monument in the Kendal cemetery. The cemetery currently has no gravestones or other markings to indicate to anyone passing by of

the significance of this site. The new monument will be a fitting memorial to those early settlers who were buried long ago in this cemetery.

The granite monument was designed by Massillon Heritage Foundation board member John Patrick Picard, who has donated his architectural services for this project. A description and illustration of the monument was featured in the Fall 2018 newsletter. The installation is expected to take place in the latter part of May.

Education ~

This past fall, we met with Stark County curriculum directors at the Stark County Educational Center and presented our third grade field trip to all curriculum directors.

We passed out our personalized student handbooks, designed

to fit the core curriculum at the third grade level in social studies focusing on the history of the MWC, and also a flyer that gives all the information needed to arrange a FREE field trip for third graders. Our hope was that they would relay the information back to their teachers. It has been difficult to get teachers to sign up, not because there is no interest, but instead because of no bussing and testing times.

A meeting was held with Massillon's new superintendent, Paul Salvino, and he was given the same information. He was very interested and said he would discuss it at his principal meetings and promote this as part of the curriculum.

Recently flyers and available tour dates at MWC were again given to the schools.

We received a response from Gorrell Elementary, the field trip is scheduled for May 23^{rd} . We are anticipating hearing from the other schools.

We will meet with teachers from Perry, Tuslaw, and other schools before the end of the year to generate interest for the coming year (2019–20).

We feel very passionate about this program and feel it is relevant and important for students to learn about history and their community. We have an excellent program and welcome anyone with new and fresh ideas. We also want to create a program for the high school level focusing on building trades and architecture.

Massillon Cemetery Clean-Up Day to Include the McClymonds/Russell Plot

Inspired by the recent storm damage at Massillon Cemetery, a community clean-up day has been scheduled. Under the auspices of the Massillon Area Clergy Association, volunteers are invited to bring gloves and tools on Saturday, May 11, 9:00 a.m. to noon, rain or shine.

The small plot contains a beautiful statue of a woman holding an anchor—the symbol of hope—and a gnarly rhododendron bush that still blooms, along with the headstones of J. Walter and Flora McClymonds, Annie Russell McClymonds, Nahum and Esther Russell, and several other Russell brothers and their wives.
